Community members have several opportunities to provide their input as the design details are defined for the Middlefield Road Redesign. Over 75 people attended the first community design workshop on September 30, 2015 to prioritize various aspects of the design, including sidewalk widths and other amenities. The 35 steering

committee members, along with the design team, will ask additional questions regarding the street design at the next **community workshop on November 4**th. Please join the conversation!

ACCOUNTABILITY

Promoting individual accountability and enforcing existing laws.

The County of San Mateo is committed to addressing key issues in North Fair Oaks, including illegal dumping and code enforcement:

- <u>Neighborhood Response Team (NRT)</u>: The NRT is a multi-departmental partnership of the Sheriff's Office, County Counsel, Planning & Building Department, Environmental Health, and Public Works led by the County Manager's Office to coordinate and address priority issues for the North Fair Oaks community.
- <u>Code Enforcement Officers</u>: Three new code enforcement officers have been hired to work with residents to resolve issues within the community.
- Report It! SMC: In May 2015, the County launched Report It! SMC, an app for reporting illegal dumping in North Fair Oaks. Residents can download the app for free and report illegal dumping from their smartphones, or submit reports online at www.seeclickfix.com.

VISION

Bringing the vision of the North Fair Oaks Community Plan to life.
